Barney's Target Numbers

Number of players: 1+ a leader

Equipment:

- 5 tennis balls and a garage wall (outside)
- 5 table tennis or sponge balls and a target board inside
- On the garage wall draw 10 or more large circles in chalk with a number on the inside. This could for example be times tables numbers.
- If playing indoors, place post it notes or stickers with numbers on over the large board. Stand the ball up against a wall or chair.

Playing Space: Outside or in.

Aim: To gain 15 points (1 player) or the most points (more than 1 player or if playing in teams).

How to Play:

Each ball is worth 3 points. 1 point is scored if the player catches the ball from the leader. 2 points are scored if the player catches the ball and gets the maths question correct. 3 points are scored if the player catches the ball, answers the maths question correctly and throws the ball to hit the correct answer.

The thrower decides on 10 maths questions to match the answers in the circles.

Play starts with the player being thrown the ball (1 point for a catch). Then the leader asks the question (eg 2×2). Player answers 4 and scores another point. The final point is scored when the Player hits the number 4 target on the wall/board.

If playing in teams, reduce the number of balls per player to avoid team members waiting around. The team with the highest total wins.
